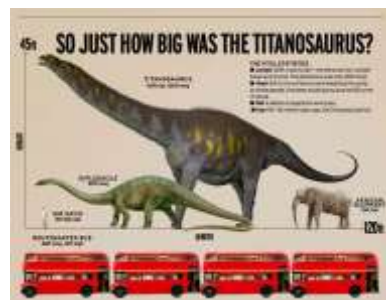




In the desert, La Flecha, a new dinosaur was found in Argentina in September 2014. A shepherd was looking for his sheep when he found one of the bones from the massive beast. The shepherd didn't realise how important it was and so he just went on to find his sheep.

There were up to 233 bones from the massive beast called the titanosaur. The titanosaur was 122 feet long, and weighed up to 70 tons and that is as much as 10 African Elephants. The Titanosaur's neck is 39 feet long.

The desert that the shepherd found the bone of the titanosaur is in La Flecha, 135 miles west of Trelew, Patagonia.



Before the titanosaur was found, all that scientists knew about this was the 2nd biggest type of dinosaur which are called sauropods. Sauropods are very large quadrupedal herbivorous dinosaurs with a long neck and tail, small head, and massive limbs.

The person who was hosting this find was David Attenborough. David Attenborough went to central Argentina where a shepherd was looking for his sheep and he found a random bone sticking out of the ground, but he didn't realise how important the bone would be for dinosaur history. Now we can get on with trying to find more of the new species.
